The CAC is a group of environmentally concerned residents from throughout the watershed who meet monthly to assist and advise CRWD's Board of Managers. We:

- Participate in CRWD planning processes; watershed plan preparation and long-term implementation of District programs
- Serve as a communication link between citizens of the District and the Board
- Develop projects to bring to the Board and staff for consideration
- Review and comment on the annual budget of the District
- Coordinate an annual awards program to recognize outstanding residents, partners and projects of the District
- Sponsor guest speakers
- Attend tours of projects and features in CRWD
- Participate in public education about the District and its work.

CAC meetings are open to the public, so come to a meeting and learn about CRWD, get to know the CAC and see if you are interested in becoming a member. Meetings are usually held the second Wednesday of the month from 7-9 p.m. at the CRWD office.

Green Line Green Infrastructure

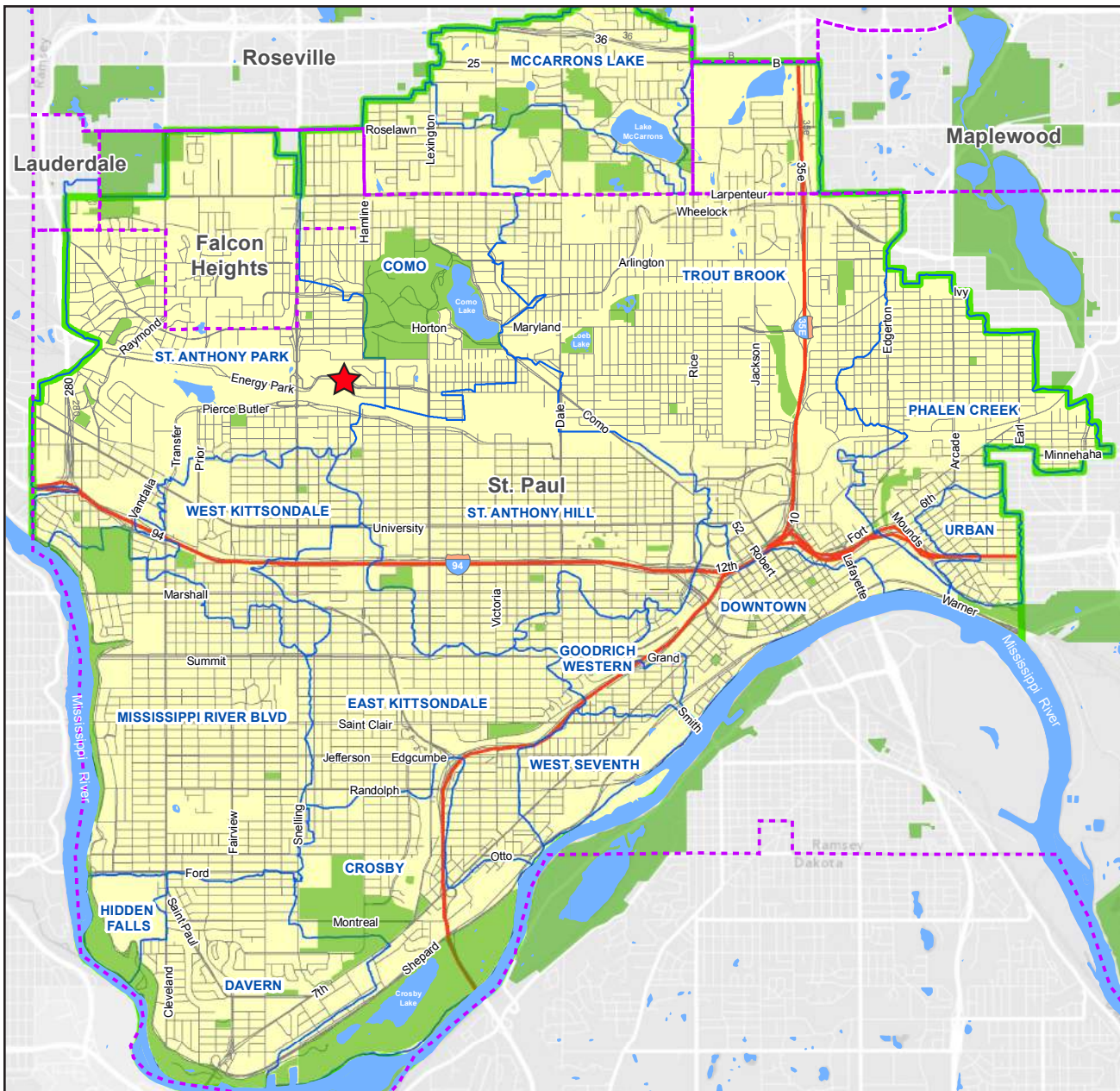


Green infrastructure practices like this tree trench system treat stormwater along the Green Line on University Avenue.

What is CRWD?

CRWD is a special purpose local unit of government created to manage and protect part of the Mississippi River basin along with the wetlands, creeks and lakes in the District that drain to the river. CRWD covers 40 square miles and includes portions of Falcon Heights, Lauderdale, Roseville, Maplewood and Saint Paul. It is located in Ramsey County and has a population of 225,000. CRWD's mission is to protect, manage and improve the water resources of the District.
