B) 2023 Lakes Data Summary (Wein)

Ms. Wein reported on the 2023 Lakes Data Summary. Monitoring data collected from all five lakes located in CRWD includes chemical, physical, and biological data, which is then analyzed, summarized, and compared with previous years. In general, 2023 was a good year for CRWD lakes, with above-average precipitation following two years of drought, bringing water levels back to normal. Como Lake has been a big success story and has positively responded to the management actions undertaken in the CRWD Como Lake Management Plan.
