What is CRWD?

Capitol Region Watershed District (CRWD) is a local, special-purpose unit of government that works to protect, manage, and improve the lakes, streams, rivers, and wetlands of the District.

The District covers 40 square miles, is home to 212,000 people, and includes portions of the cities of Falcon Heights, Lauderdale, Maplewood, Roseville, and Saint Paul, Minnesota. All the water in the District eventually drains to the Mississippi River.

About the CAC

We are residents from throughout the watershed who care about water.

As CAC members we:

- Review what CRWD and other groups are doing to improve our lakes and rivers.
- Participate in CRWD planning processes and programs.
- Hold an annual awards program to recognize residents and partners who have done outstanding work protecting and improving our water resources.
- Communicate with fellow watershed residents about what CRWD does.
- Develop projects to bring to the Board and staff for consideration.
- Review and comment on the annual budget.
- Sponsor guest speakers.
- Attend project tours in the District.

As a volunteer you will learn a lot about how our water systems and projects work and have the satisfaction of helping preserve our natural resources.
